WHAT ARE PRONOUNS?

You already know most of them:

I/Me/Mine - You/You/Yours - He/Him/His - She/Her/Hers - They/Them/Theirs

WHY ARE THEY IMPORTANT?

Language, whether written or verbal, can have a profound impact on individuals and communities. As individuals we convey our respect and help others to recognize who we are referencing when we accurately use a person's pronouns to refer to them.

HOW DO I KNOW WHICH ONE TO USE?

You can ask! Some examples of how to do that are:

Ask directly: "What pronouns do you use?"

Listen to what pronouns other people are using for that person.

Ask someone who knows that person to tell you.

Include it as a standard question on forms and registrations.

WHAT IF I MESS UP?

It is totally normal for mistakes to happen while you're getting used to something new. Acknowledge that you made a mistake, make the correction quickly, apologize simply and briefly, and commit to getting it right next time.
