

## SIGNING UP FOR NOTIFICATIONS VIA WEB VERSION




# TOURNEY MACHINE/GAME SCHEDULES

## APP VERSION

Download the “Tourney Machine App” using your smartphone. Once downloaded, click on “Search for an Event.” Under Filters, enter Lacrosse for Sport, Texas for Location, and May 2022 for the Date. Click on “2022 USA Lacrosse Women’s Collegiate Lacrosse Associates Championship” which will appear near the bottom of the list.

# TOURNAMENT NOTES



## RETURNING TO TEXAS

The USA Lacrosse Women's Collegiate Lacrosse Associates (WCLA) National Championship is back in Texas for the third time overall, and for the second time in Round Rock. The championship was hosted at this same venue in 2018 after making its initial Lone Star State appearance in Dallas in 2006. Previous destinations include St. Louis (2001-04), Minneapolis (2005), Dallas (2006), Denver (2007-08), Scottsdale (2009-11), Colorado Springs (2012-13), Virginia Beach (2014-15, 2019), Winston-Salem (2016), and Salt Lake City (2017).

## THE TOP SEED

Boston College Club, 12-0, is the No. 1 seed in the Division I championship as the automatic qualifier and champion from the New England Women's Lacrosse League (NEWLL). The Eagles are making their ninth overall and fifth straight appearance in the WCLA championship tournament and earned the top seed for the first time. The Eagles had their best showing in 2014, finishing as the national championship runner-up.

## BEING THE FAVORITE

Based on recent history, being the No. 1 seed in the Division I championship isn't a bad thing. The national champion has emerged from the top line five times in the past seven championships. In 2013, Colorado State was the top seed and claimed its fourth national championship that season. In 2014 and again in 2019, Pittsburgh rode the No. 1 seed to the championship, both times in Virginia Beach. In 2015 Michigan Club emerged as champion as the number two seed, but the Wolverines also captured the title in 2018 as the top seed, here in Round Rock. In 2016, No. 1 Georgia won its first title. The only major exception was in 2017, with No. 7 seed Delaware upsetting No.1 Pittsburgh in the championship game.

*Michigan won its second Division I championship the last time this event came to Round Rock, in 2018, defeating BYU in the final.*

## THE FAVORITE – DIVISION II

In the Division II bracket, Utah Valley (11-1 overall) earned the top seed for the first time and received a first round bye in the tournament. Making just its second appearance in the championship tournament, the Wolverines were the 2022 champions of the Rocky Mountain Women's Lacrosse League (RMWLL). Loyola Maryland Club, national champion in 2018 & 2019, is the number two seed after winning the Mid Atlantic Women's Lacrosse League championship. Grand Valley State Club received the number three seed and UC San Diego is seeded fourth.

## HELLO NEWCOMERS

There are two first-timers among the 16 teams in this year's Division I field. Florida State and Clemson, both members of the Southeastern Women's Lacrosse League, are making their first appearances in the tournament. No. 8 Utah is also appearing in the Division I field for the first time but made seven prior appearances as a Division II member. Also of note, Arizona State Club returns following a long hiatus, having made its only prior appearance in 2005. At the other end of the spectrum, Michigan leads all participants with its 18th overall appearance and 10th straight showing in the D-I national tournament.

## MORE IS BETTER IN D-II

For the first time since the start of the Division II championship in 2010, the D-II tournament field has expanded and will have 15 competing teams and a single-elimination format. Previously played as a 12-team event, the Division II teams utilized a pod system with round-robin play within each pod determining the qualifiers for the semifinal round. Single-elimination will now be utilized throughout, with each losing team moving into the consolation bracket to determine its final placement.

## D-II FIRST-TIMERS

In Division II, eight teams in this year's field were also participants in the last championship, played in 2019, and 12 of 15 teams have appeared previously. The three teams making their first-ever tournament appearances are No. 10 seed Boise State, No. 11 Portland, and No. 12 UC Santa Cruz. Also, No. 4 seed UC San Diego returns for the first time since 2014 and No. 7 CSU San Marcos is back for the first time since 2016.

# ABOUT THE WCLA & OFFICIALS

The mission of the USA Lacrosse Women's Collegiate Lacrosse Associates (WCLA) is to promote the growth of women's lacrosse nationwide. Specifically, the WCLA strives to provide an infrastructure in which collegiate clubs will compete and eventually crown a national champion.

The WCLA first staged a national championship under the USA Lacrosse umbrella in 2001, and the leadership of the WCLA has been the driving force behind the development of women's college club lacrosse since its formation. Leadership opportunities exist on the local, regional, and national levels as WCLA is a representation of teams at all levels.

More than 230 teams now compete in 10 conferences throughout

the country, and the WCLA sponsors play at both the Division I and II levels.

The WCLA helps publicize women's college club lacrosse by selecting All-Americans and All-Academic honorees each year, conducting weekly ranking polls, and conducting a national championship at the Division I and II level. The WCLA also provides resources to new and developing club teams to help them become successful.

The large majority of WCLA teams are student-run, and in addition to gaining valuable experience in administration, the WCLA players have a history of giving back to the sport by becoming coaches and/or officials.

# TOURNAMENT HISTORY

*No. 7 seed Delaware upset No. 1 Pittsburgh in the 2017 D-I final, becoming one of the lowest seeds to win the championship.*



The USA Lacrosse Women's Collegiate Lacrosse Associates (WCLA) National Championship was first conducted in 2001, providing college club teams a consistent and true structure to compete nationally. Prior to 2001 there were sporadic championships conducted through other organizations.

Cal Poly won the initial eight-team national tournament in St. Louis in 2001, beginning a run of seven consecutive national championships. The Mustangs defeated Navy in the first championship game, and knocked off Air Force, UCLA and Santa Clara in successive years to extend its championship streak.

The tournament expanded from eight to 12 teams in 2004, and then to 16 teams in 2005 when the event moved to Minneapolis. Cal Poly survived harsh weather conditions, beating Colorado State in the 2005 title game. The Mustangs then defeated Michigan in the 2006 final, and Navy, again, in 2007 to win their seventh straight championship.

The Cal Poly dynasty finally ended in 2008, with Colorado State rallying for an 8-5 overtime win over the Mustangs in the championship game in Denver. Cal Poly still leads all WCLA programs with 36 all-time tournament wins.

Virginia Tech was making just its third WCLA tournament appearance in 2009 and came into the event carrying a No. 6 seed, but it mattered little as the Hokies marched to the title.

Colorado State returned to the top spot in 2010, pulling off four straight upset victories as the No. 11 seed to capture its second championship. The Rams defeated Cal Poly, 6-4, in the final. Meanwhile, Cal Berkeley Club captured the inaugural Division II

championship, beating Loyola (Md.) Club in the title game.

Colorado State made it two-in-a-row and won its third overall championship by defeating UCLA in the 2011 final. In the Division II final, Chapman edged Towson Club, 9-8, to complete an undefeated season.

Tenth-seeded UC Davis Club surprised top-seeded Colorado State in the 2012 championship game, denying the Rams a third consecutive national title. In Division II, North Carolina Club edged Towson Club, 9-8, marking the second consecutive one-goal loss for Towson in the championship.

Colorado State became the first No. 1 seed to win the championship in six years by claiming the 2013 title to cap an undefeated season. James Madison also had a lot to celebrate by winning the Division II crown in their first-ever tournament appearance.

In 2014, the tournament venue moved to the East Coast for the first time and Pittsburgh became just the second eastern team to capture the title. Top-seeded Pitt held off upstart Boston College, the No. 15 seed, in the championship game to claim its first title. In Division II, North Carolina Club capped an undefeated season by rallying for a 10-9 victory over defending champion James Madison in the final.

There was nothing unlucky for Michigan in 2015 as the Wolverines made their 13th WCLA appearance and captured their first championship by defeating Virginia Tech in the final. In Division II, No. 1 seed Duke capped an undefeated season by registering an 8-3 win over Utah in the championship game.

The 2016 tournament yielded two more first-time champions as Georgia claimed the Division I title, beating Minnesota in the final game. The No. 1 seed Bulldogs had made nine previous trips to the tournament without ever reaching the semifinal round. In Division II, Denver Club had to work overtime to claim its first title, defeating Utah 11-10 in sudden-death. Utah finished as the national runner-up for the second straight year and third time in four years.

The tournament moved west once again in 2017, hosted in Salt Lake City. Delaware Club captured the D-I title as the No. 7 seeded Blue Hens upset No. 1 Pittsburgh, 13-11, in the championship game. Denver Club also made tournament history by becoming the first back-to-back champion in the history of the Division II championship. The Pioneers defeated Loyola Maryland in the final and finished the year with a 13-game winning streak.

Michigan claimed its second Division I crown in 2018, capping an undefeated season with a win over BYU in the final game. In Division II, Loyola (Md.) Club earned some revenge by dethroning Denver Club, 14-3, in the title game to claim its first championship.

In 2019, the last time the championship was played, Pittsburgh defeated Delaware Club, 15-11, to capture its second Division I title, while Loyola Club downed Navy Club, 13-6, to claim its second straight Division II crown.


