

SIGNING UP FOR NOTIFICATIONS VIA WEB VERSION





APP VERSION

Download the “Tourney Machine App” using your smartphone. Once downloaded, click on “Search for an Event.” Under Filters, enter Lacrosse for Sport, Virginia for Location, and May 2023 for the Date. Click on “2023 USA Lacrosse Women’s Collegiate Lacrosse Associates Championship.” To follow a specific team, click on “Find Your Team” on the home page. Once you’ve found the team you want to follow, hit the jersey icon next to their name or click on their name to be taken to their team page. When you go back to the Home Page, the team(s) you’re following will appear.



ON THE APP’S MAIN PAGE, THERE ARE FOUR OPTIONS ACROSS THE BOTTOM; EACH OPTION SERVES A DIFFERENT PURPOSE.

TOURNAMENT NOTES



RETURNING TO VIRGINIA BEACH

The USA Lacrosse Women's Collegiate Lacrosse Associates (WCLA) National Championship is back in Virginia Beach and the Princess Anne Athletic Complex for the fourth time, with previous visits here in 2014, 2015, and 2019. This location has been especially kind to Pittsburgh, which won both of its WCLA titles (2014 & 2019) at this venue. Other destinations for the WCLA championship include St. Louis (2001-04), Minneapolis (2005), Dallas (2006), Denver (2007-08), Scottsdale (2009-11), Colorado Springs (2012-13), Winston-Salem (2016), Salt Lake City (2017), and Round Rock, Texas (2018, 2022).

THE TOP SEED

Boston College Club, 14-0, is the No. 1 seed in the Division I championship as the automatic qualifier and champion from the Northeast Women's Lacrosse League (NWLL). The Eagles are the defending national champion and are making their 10th overall and sixth straight appearance in the WCLA national tournament. Unbeaten since the start of the 2022 season, the Eagles bring a 30-game winning streak into this year's event and are trying to become the first back-to-back Division I champion since Colorado State in 2010 and 2011.

BEING THE FAVORITE

Based on recent history, being the No. 1 seed in the Division I championship is a good omen. The national champion has emerged from the top line six times in the past eight championships, including 2022 champion BC. In 2013, Colorado State was the top seed and claimed its fourth national championship that season. In 2014 and again in 2019, Pittsburgh rode the No. 1 seed to the championship, both times in Virginia Beach. In 2015 Michigan Club emerged as champion as the number two seed, but the Wolverines also captured the title in 2018 as the top seed. In 2016, No. 1 Georgia won its first title. The only major exception was in 2017, with No. 7 seed Delaware upsetting No.1 Pittsburgh in the championship game.

Pittsburgh won its second Division I championship the last time this event came to Virginia Beach, in 2019, defeating Delaware 15-11 in the final.

THE FAVORITE – DIVISION II

In the Division II bracket, Utah Valley (14-1 overall) earned the top seed for the second straight year and is making its third overall appearance in the championship tournament. The Wolverines advanced to the national semifinals in 2022 before being upset by Vermont in a thrilling game that came down to the final seconds. Utah Valley may once again have to navigate past either the Catamounts or another of member the Northeast Women's Lacrosse League as the next three seeds – No. 2 New Hampshire Club, No. 3 Vermont, and No. 4 Providence – all hail from the NWLL.

PRIOR EXPERIENCE REQUIRED

There are no first-timers among the 16 teams in this year's Division I field, and in fact, 13 of the 16 teams were qualifiers for last year's national tournament. No. 16 seed Florida State, which made its inaugural appearance in 2022, is the least experienced team in the field, with No. 13 Arizona State Club ranking as the next most inexperienced, with just two prior appearances in 2005 and 2022. No. 15 Michigan State has had the longest hiatus from the event, returning this year after making its last appearance in 2008. At the other end of the spectrum, Michigan leads all participants with its 19th overall appearance and 11th straight showing in the D-I national tournament.

FAMILIAR TEAMS IN DIVISION II

In Division II, nine of the 12 teams in this year's field were also participants in last year's championship event, played in Round Rock. The only newcomers in D-II this year are No. 12 Pacific Lutheran, making their first-ever appearance, No. 8 seed Santa Barbara City (last appeared in 2013), and No. 11 Portland State (last appeared in 2019). No. 5 Denver Club is the most experienced D-II program, returning to the national tournament for the eighth time overall. The Pioneers were national champions in 2016 & 2017.

TOURNAMENT NOTES



Utah Valley has earned the No. 1 seed in the Division II tournament in each of the past two seasons. The Wolverines bring a 14-1 record to Virginia Beach.

THE FORMAT

The Division I and Division II formats are slightly different due to the variance in the number of teams. The Division I format calls for a traditional single-elimination bracket to determine the champion. Following each team's first loss, it moves into the consolation bracket to determine its final placement. In Division II, the teams are arranged into four pools of three teams each. A round-robin within each pod determines the qualifier that advances into the semifinal round. Single-elimination is utilized in the semifinals and final.

ABOUT THE WCLA & OFFICIALS

The mission of the USA Lacrosse Women's Collegiate Lacrosse Associates (WCLA) is to promote the growth of women's lacrosse nationwide. Specifically, the WCLA strives to provide an infrastructure in which collegiate clubs will compete and eventually crown a national champion.

The WCLA first staged a national championship under the USA Lacrosse umbrella in 2001, and the leadership of the WCLA has been the driving force behind the development of women's college club lacrosse since its formation. Leadership opportunities exist on the local, regional, and national levels as WCLA is a representation of teams at all levels.

Nearly 150 teams compete in nine leagues throughout the country, and the WCLA sponsors play at both the Division I and II levels.

The WCLA helps publicize women's college club lacrosse by selecting All-Americans and All-Academic honorees each year, conducting weekly ranking polls, and conducting a national championship at the Division I and II level. The WCLA also provides resources to new and developing club teams to help them become successful.

The large majority of WCLA teams are student-run, and in addition to gaining valuable experience in administration, the WCLA players have a history of giving back to the sport by becoming coaches and/or officials.

TOURNAMENT HISTORY

No. 7 seed Delaware upset No. 1 Pittsburgh in the 2017 D-I final, becoming one of the lowest seeds to win the championship.



The USA Lacrosse Women's Collegiate Lacrosse Associates (WCLA) National Championship was first conducted in 2001, providing college club teams a consistent and true structure to compete nationally. Prior to 2001 there were sporadic championships conducted through other organizations.

Cal Poly won the initial eight-team national tournament in St. Louis in 2001, beginning a run of seven consecutive national championships. The Mustangs defeated Navy in the first championship game, and knocked off Air Force, UCLA, and Santa Clara in successive years to extend its championship streak.

The tournament expanded from eight to 12 teams in 2004, and then to 16 teams in 2005 when the event moved to Minneapolis. Cal Poly survived harsh weather conditions, beating Colorado State in the 2005 title game. The Mustangs then defeated Michigan in the 2006 final, and Navy, again, in 2007 to win their seventh straight championship.

The Cal Poly dynasty finally ended in 2008, with Colorado State rallying for an 8-5 overtime win over the Mustangs in the championship game in Denver. Cal Poly still leads all WCLA programs with 36 all-time tournament wins.

Virginia Tech was making just its third WCLA tournament appearance in 2009 and came into the event carrying a No. 6 seed, but it mattered little as the Hokies marched to the title.

Colorado State returned to the top spot in 2010, pulling off four straight upset victories as the No. 11 seed to capture its second championship. The Rams defeated Cal Poly, 6-4, in the final. Meanwhile, Cal Berkeley Club captured the inaugural Division II championship, beating Loyola (Md.) Club in the title game.

Colorado State made it two-in-a-row and won its third overall championship by defeating UCLA in the 2011 final. In the Division II final, Chapman edged Towson Club, 9-8, to complete an undefeated season.

Tenth-seeded UC Davis Club surprised top-seeded Colorado State in the 2012 championship game, denying the Rams a third consecutive national title. In Division II, North Carolina Club edged Towson Club, 9-8, marking the second consecutive one-goal loss for Towson in the championship.

Colorado State became the first No. 1 seed to win the championship in six years by claiming the 2013 title to cap an undefeated season. James Madison also had a lot to celebrate by winning the Division II crown in its first-ever tournament appearance.

In 2014, the tournament venue moved to the East Coast for the first time and Pittsburgh became just the second eastern team to capture the title. Top-seeded Pitt held off upstart Boston College, the No. 15 seed, in the championship game to claim its first title. In Division II, North Carolina Club capped an undefeated season by rallying for a 10-9 victory over defending champion James Madison in the final.

There was nothing unlucky for Michigan in 2015 as the Wolverines made their 13th WCLA appearance and captured their first championship by defeating Virginia Tech in the final. In Division II, No. 1 seed Duke capped an undefeated season by registering an 8-3 win over Utah in the championship game.

The 2016 tournament yielded two more first-time champions as Georgia claimed the Division I title, beating Minnesota in the final game. The No. 1 seed Bulldogs had made nine previous trips to the tournament without ever reaching the semifinal round. In Division II, Denver Club worked overtime to claim its first title, defeating Utah 11-10 in sudden-death. Utah finished as the national runner-up for the third time in four years.

The tournament moved west once again in 2017, hosted in Salt Lake City. Delaware Club captured the D-I title as the No. 7 seeded Blue Hens upset No. 1 Pittsburgh, 13-11, in the championship game. Denver Club also made tournament history by becoming the first back-to-back champion in the history of the Division II championship. The Pioneers defeated Loyola Maryland in the final and finished the year with a 13-game winning streak.

Michigan claimed its second Division I crown in 2018, capping an undefeated season with a win over BYU in the final game. In Division II, Loyola (Md.) Club earned some revenge by dethroning Denver Club, 14-3, in the title game to claim its first championship.

In 2019, Pittsburgh defeated Delaware Club, 15-11, to capture its second Division I title, while Loyola Club downed Navy Club, 13-6, to claim its second straight Division II crown.

Following a two-year hiatus (2020 & 2021) due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the championship returned in 2022 with Boston College Club winning the Division I crown and Loyola (Md.) Club claiming its third straight D-II title.
