What awards are available for selection during the 2021 US Lacrosse high school lacrosse season?

- All-American
- All-Academic
- Bob Scott/ Jackie Pitts
- Coach of the Year

What are the deadlines for the 2021 US Lacrosse High School Awards?

- Local Area Deadlines: **Determined locally by your Area Chair**

- Final Selections due to US Lacrosse: **July 1, 2021**
- US Lacrosse Press Release: **July 15, 2021**

How many awards is each area allotted?

- All-American: 1 honor per every 6 qualified programs
- All-Academic: 1 honor per every 6 qualified programs

Note: Schools not participating in the 2021 season do not count toward awards allotment.

Note: Honors round up to at .5 or more. (i.e., Area X has 15 qualified programs, $15/6 = 2.5$, Area X is allotted 3 All-American and 3 All-Academic honors)

- Bob Scott/Jackie Pitts: 1 honor per award area (no co-winners)
- Coach of the Year: 1 honor per award area (no co-winners)

What is the minimum number of games an athlete must play to be eligible for nomination?

- A nominee must play in a minimum of 9 games to be eligible for consideration for the 2021 lacrosse season.

What is the minimum number of qualified programs needed to participate in the 2021 US Lacrosse High School Awards?

- A minimum of 10 qualified programs is required.

Can awards be selected by the committee rather than a vote of all coaches?

- Yes, with the majority support of your area coaches, you can use a committee to select your area awards. Please see the handbook for requirements.
