<b>1 – Professionalism and Fitness</b>			
<b>Arrives on time, in approved uniform</b> Arrived with partner on time, wearing approved uniform including black accessories.	<b>Show endurance and speed for level of play</b> Keeps up with play throughout the game, Able to recover from a fast break or quick turnover.		
<b>2 – Rules Knowledge and Judgement</b>			
<b>Calls necessary safety violations:</b> Recognizes and correctly calls personal fouls through the entire game	<b>Understands technical fouls:</b> Recognizes and correctly calls technical fouls when ball is loose or in possession		
<b>Demonstrates sound judgement</b> Keeps a clear threshold for penalties through the entire game and also knows when to adjust that threshold to the situation	<b>Applies the rules consistently</b> The officials calls a slash in the 4 <sup>th</sup> that is the same slash call made in the 1st		
<b>3 – Mechanics and Positioning</b>			
<b>Shows understanding of Areas of Responsibility</b> Stays open to play, keeps majority of players in visual field. Demonstrates purposeful movement.	<b>Demonstrates proper Lead position</b> Stays ahead of play. Adjusts position in Lead relative to the ball and players. Moves to best see between players.		
<b>Stays up with play in transition as trail</b> Maintains relative position to ball/play in transition. Adjusts laterally as play dictates.	<b>Uses correct T.O. goal signals and face-off mechanics</b> Time-out and goal signals correct and clear. Follows proper face-off mechanics; from setting to possession.		
<b>Proper faceoff positioning and procedures</b> Knows which position to get to following the faceoff if the FO official or one of the wing officials, and the correct rotation after goals.			
<b>4 – Game Management</b>			
<b>Makes timely calls.</b> Reacts quickly to unsafe play. Manages unsporting behavior.	<b>Stays focused during dead ball time</b> Officiates players and all aspects of the game in dead ball situations		
<b>Officiates off-ball.</b> Watches off ball play as trail/lead and calls fouls when needed. Adjusts positioning to off ball play.	<b>Good Live ball awareness</b> Keeps eyes on right area of the field based off on/off ball responsibilities and anticipates where the play will go to adjust positioning to better officiate next plays		
<b>5 – Communication / Comportment</b>			
<b>Exhibits high level of professionalism</b> Show respect for all involved in the game. Receptive to feedback. Accepts help as needed.	<b>Strong field presence</b> Demonstrates a competent and confident field presence. Unobtrusive part of the game.		
<b>Communicates effectively with coaches, game admin and players</b> Controls tone and volume of voice. Uses proper terminology for fouls. Acknowledges coaches questions and responds appropriately
