Demonstrates sound judgement Keeps a clear threshold for penalties through the entire game and also knows when to adjust that threshold to the situation	Applies the rules consistently The officials calls a slash in the 4 th that is the same slash call made in the 1st		
3 – Mechanics and Positioning			
Shows understanding of Areas of Responsibility Stays open to play, keeps majority of players in visual field. Demonstrates purposeful movement.	Demonstrates proper Lead position Stays ahead of play. Adjusts position in Lead relative to the ball and players. Moves to best see between players.
