## POINTS OF EMPHASIS

### **CROSSE SPECIFICATIONS**

- Boys' or girls' lacrosse heads are legal for play at 10U and below.
- Regardless of which head is used, players must still meet the boys' stringing and pocket depth requirements.
- Only boys' lacrosse heads are legal for play at 12U and above.

## **CROSSE SPECIFICATIONS**

### Lacrosse Head Specifications

### A HEAD DIMENSIONS

All measurements must be taken on the front face of the crosse. It shall be a minimum of 6 inches between the insides of the sidewalls at the widest point and a minimum of 10 inches from the outside edge of the crosse head to the beginning of the throat.

Note: Both Old NFHS and current NFHS/NCAA stick specifications are legal for youth lacrosse.

### B SHOOTING STRINGS


Any laces or strings must be within 4 inches of the top of the crosse head (this does not apply to goalkeepers).

## G STRINGS OUTSIDE OF CROSSE

Any strings or leathers hanging off the crosse must measure 2 inches or less.

## O CIRCUMFERENCE OF THE CROSSE HANDLE

No more than 3.5 inches.

# THE THE NOTE OF TAXABLE

## POINTS OF EMPHASIS

### USA LACROSSE YOUTH RULES VS NFHS RULES

- No "Take Out" Body Checks
- 3-yard Contact Rule vs 5-yards Contact Rule
- Targeting Fouls are an Automatic Ejection
- One-Handed Stick Checks are an Automatic Slash
- Fouling Out = 3 Personal Fouls or 5 Minutes of Personal Foul Time
- Ball Hitting the Ground (not on a shot) Stops a Slow Whistles Situation





## **POINTS OF EMPHASIS**

## SMALL-SIDED RULES vs USA Lacrosse Youth Rules

- Players at 10U May Go to a Knee on Faceoffs
- Body Contact = Legal Holds, Legal Pushes, "Boxing Out", and Some Incidental Contact
- Stick Contact = Lift Check, Poke Check, and All Checks Made Below the Shoulder (No Wood Chopping)
- No Time Serving Penalties, Teams Play at Even Strength

## MAJOR RULES CHANGES AND CLARIFICATIONS

### **RULE 3.2 SCORE DIFFERENTIAL**


- Running Clocks
  - During the 2nd Half Only
  - Once the score differential reaches 12 goals (e.g., 12-0 or 15-3)
  - Running Game Time and Penalty Time
- What happens if the score falls under 12 goals again?
  - No change. The clock remains a running clock for the remainder of the game once running time starts except for team timeouts, injuries, or a period ends.
- Mercy Rule
  - During the 2nd Half Only
  - Once the score differential reaches 12 goals (e.g., 12-0 or 15-3)
  - Trailing Team's Head Coach has the option to start with possession of the ball at midfield or faceoff.
  - Once the score reverts to 6 goals or less, normal faceoff rules apply.

# MAJOR RULES CHANGES AND CLARIFICATIONS

## Rule 4.3 FACING OFF

- Ball is placed on the midline by officials to designate the faceoff location.
- Players must stand for the faceoff position (optional 10U).
- All fingers shall be wrapped around the crosse.
- Crosse head and gloved hands shall be touching the ground.
- Hand closer to the throat of the lacrosse head shall be in a palm-up position.
- The "Motorcycle Grip" or Moto Grip is Illegal
- Faceoff players must play the ball first.





# THE SENTATION TITE HER

## MAJOR RULES CHANGES AND CLARIFICATIONS

### **RULE 4.4 CONTACT TO FACEOFF PLAYERS**

When the whistle sounds to start play, the players in the wing areas are released, but must avoid checking the faceoff players battling while down in a defenseless position for control of the ball in the initial faceoff spot.

## MAJOR RULES CHANGES AND CLARIFICATIONS

## RULE 4.24 OFFICIALS TIMEOUTS BECAUSE OF LOST EQUIPMENT

- If a player loses any mandatory personal equipment when in a scrimmage area, is in possession of the ball, or a player is apparently injured, play shall be suspended immediately.
- If a player not in possession of the ball legally loses mandatory equipment and no other players are in the immediate vicinity, then the play may continue.
- Play shall also be immediately suspended if the goalkeeper's crosse or any other mandatory equipment becomes broken or malfunctions.

## MAJOR RULES CHANGES AND CLARIFICATIONS

### **RULE 5.5.13 MISCONDUCT FOULS**

- Misconduct penalties are only for players.
- Players cannot be given misconduct without a time-serving penalty.
- Misconduct penalty time begins after a player's technical or personal foul is released. Teams will then be playing all even.
- Misconduct penalty time is served for its entire duration.
- Misconduct penalty time does not count toward fouling out or ejections.
- As is the case with all time-serving penalties, any misconduct penalty remaining at the end of a period shall carry over into subsequent periods.

# Rule 7.8 SCORING PLAYS IN PROGRESS DURING SLOW WHISTLE SITUATIONS

Criteria for Determining a Scoring Play in Progress

- The ball is in the attacking team's offensive half of the field.
- The ball is continuously advanced toward the goal.
- A team advancing toward the goal that takes the ball behind goal line extended is no longer advancing toward the goal.
- An in-progress scoring play can start from behind goal line extended, but once the ball is brought above goal line extended, it may not go back.
- A team is only allowed one shot attempt on goal.
- Any other reason that normally stops a slow whistle situation which in youth lacrosse includes a ball hitting the ground, except on a shot.
